Ohio Revised Code section 3319.39 requires the Board of Education to obtain a criminal records check of prospective employees. This is completed by fingerprinting, which is done at the Triway Board of Education Office. Cost for fingerprinting is \$55.00. Checks, money orders, or cash are accepted.

READ CAREFULLY

Due to the length of time required for completion of the records check, it may occasionally be necessary to employ a person prior to the Board of Education having received the results of the criminal records investigation. However, by signing this document I specifically agree that if I am employed by the Board of Education prior to its receipt of a response from BCI and the FBI, my employment shall be contingent upon subsequent receipt by the Board of Education reports from BCI and the FBI. In the event I have been employed prior to the Board of Education having received both reports, and the subsequent reports indicate that I have been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a unemployable offense, I specifically agree that the action of the Board of Education employing me shall be void without any further act by either party, and that my employment will terminate immediately without the necessity of proceedings to formally terminate my contract of employment.

I grant Triway Local Schools the authority to conduct a criminal records check and will provide a complete set of fingerprints prior to being considered for a position. I certify the information supplied in this application is correct.

Any person who knowingly makes a false statement is guilty of falsification under section 2921.13 of the revised code, which is a misdemeanor of the first degree.

SUPPLEMENT TO EMPLOYMENT APPLICATION**

NOTICE OF UNEMPLOYABLE OFFENSES

O.R.C. § 9.73 permits public employers to notify applicants on the application for employment of provisions of Ohio and federal law that disqualify an individual with a particular criminal history from employment in a certain position. Public schools and educational service centers are required to conduct criminal records checks for most positions prior to employing an individual pursuant to O.R.C. § 3319.39.

Unemployable Offenses – All Positions: Public school districts and educational service centers are prohibited by law from employing an individual who has previously been convicted of or pleaded guilty to any of the following offenses:

Unemployable Offenses – Teaching Positions: In addition to the offenses listed under *Unemployable Offenses – All Positions*, a public school district or educational service center is prohibited by law from employing an individual in a teaching position if the individual has previously been convicted of or pleaded guilty to any of the following offenses:

Unemployable Offenses – Pupil Transportation Positions: In addition to the offenses listed under *Unemployable Offenses – All Positions*, a public school district or educational service center is prohibited by law from employing an individual in a pupil transportation position if the individual has previously been convicted of or pleaded guilty to any of the following offenses:

2903.06, 2903.08, or 2903.09: Vehicular manslaughter and assault	4510.14: Driving under OVI suspension
2909.24: Terrorism	4511.194: Physical control while under the influence

Some of the unemployable offenses have time limitations for transportation position applicants. Please see O.A.C. § 3301-83-23 for further information.

In addition to the violations of Ohio law listed above, individuals are also prohibited from employment at a public school or educational service center if the individual has violated an existing or former law of Ohio, a law of another state, an ordinance of a municipal corporation, or a federal law that is substantially the same as any of the offenses or violations listed above.

An individual may be permitted to be employed even with certain unemployable offenses if he or she meets the rehabilitation criteria outlined by the Ohio Department of Education and O.A.C. § 3301-20-01.
